FROM OUR PRESIDENT

Dear St. Mary's Catholic School Alumni, Benefactors and Friends,

A few days ago, Fr. Andrew Roza, the Director of Vocations for the Archdiocese of Omaha visited St. Mary's Catholic Schools of O'Neill on his annual recruitment tour of the Catholic Schools of the archdiocese. Before he concluded his visit, he commented to me that there is "something unique and special about the students of St. Mary's." I asked him to explain what he meant, because obviously that statement could be taken a couple of ways! His explanation, was almost as good as any gift I could receive at Christmas (Nothing says I love you like a check 😊.) He replied that our Junior High and High School students have the highest level of engagement of any of the schools that he visits, and that our kids ask good questions, interact with him in an appropriate way, and that they are the happiest of any of the Junior High and High Schools that he visits each year. He also noted that they treat each other like family. That's very high praise from Fr. Roza. And he's right; our students are engaging, have great interpersonal relationship skills, are generally pretty happy, and they are like a very very large family. Which means like our own families, they're not perfect, they sometimes don't get along, but overall they work through the issues and move on toward the next task. Someone in our buildings does something every day that makes me very proud of our faculty, staff, students, administration, and parish & school families. Thanks for the gift!

Speaking of gifts, as some of you might have heard the high school roof has developed a leak problem that can no longer be solved by patching. We simply need a new roof. It was so bad that some of kids could have showered in the hallway by their lockers. We looked at the possibility of going to a hip roof, but after review by our architects and engineers, we discovered that building simply will not support the weight of that type of roof structure. So, we are back to a flat roofing system. The cost will be somewhere in the area of \$175,000. There are too many "unknowns" to get the exact dollar amount nailed down; for example we don't know how much rust there is on the steel deck or how much of the steel deck has corroded through. We have per square foot costs nailed down, but until the old roof is off there's no way to tell what we're getting into.

I am asking all of our alumni, benefactors and friends to make a gift to the "new roof" so that once spring arrives we can begin the replacement process. The ACT St. Mary's Catholic High School Scores

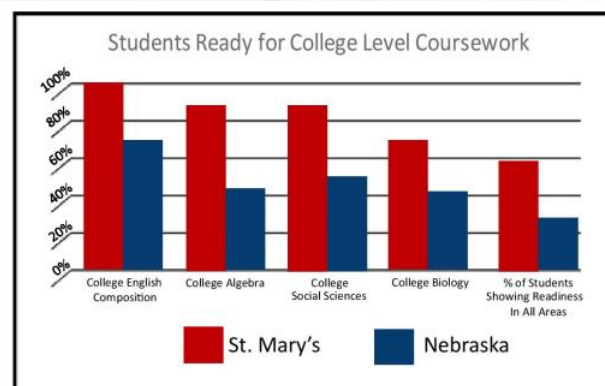

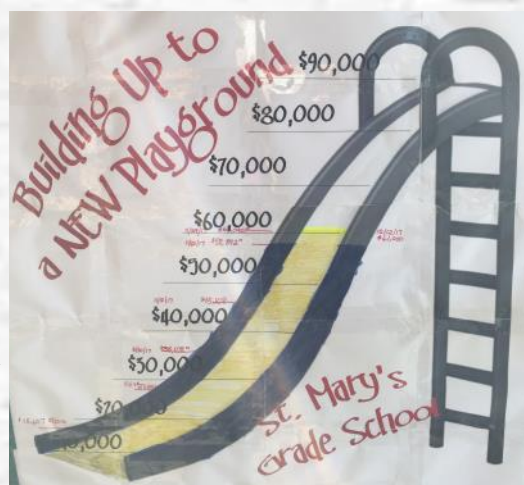
Let's Build A Playground

We've talked about it for a long time now — but it really is happening! The new playground is becoming a reality! While plans remain fluid, we are very excited that we do have a real plan in place. We have been slowly building up our funds, but the grade school students kicked it into high gear with a VERY successful Walkathon in November, raising nearly \$14,000 in 2 weeks! Our current balance is \$61,000. The estimated cost of our playground is \$90,000; we anticipate a \$10,000 grant from the state for the rubber mulch & other grant application are in place. This leaves us left to raise approximately \$19,000. (Any excess will be moved to help with the cost of the new roof on the high school.)

Part of our challenge has been the significant grade drop from one end of the playground to the other. In order to meet ADA compliance & to get the appropriate ground cover, we have to build an approximately 8 foot retaining wall to level out the far end of the playground! Rubber mulch will be used to fill the 'playground' portion of the space, which is 90' x 105'. The other area, closest to the old basketball court, will be grass (which helps to cut our cost by reducing the grading.) The old basketball court will stay in place, but we are in conversation about how to update it & make it more kid-friendly, including the possibility of painting murals. The new playground area will include swings, a large playset with equipment for development of motor skills & plenty of social space, a 'new-style' merry-go-round, a tall slide, benches, and other things yet to be determined!

The plan is to take out the old equipment quickly after school is out in May. We will have either an online or sealed bid auction to sell off the large equipment, with the removal to be done by the purchaser. Then with lots of volunteer power, we will clean off the old playground area, get the space ready to go, and get the new equipment up before fall!

With \$19,000 left to go, we need your help! Our playground has not been updated since the mid-1990s & it is past its prime. Help us to become ADA compliant & give our students a well-planned, high quality area to play, grow, and explore! Our kids are watching their "slide" fill up & they are so excited!

It is tough to believe that we are already celebrating the Christmas season, but here we are! The fall semester of the 2017-2018 school year has went by very quickly. We have a lot to be proud of in and out of the classroom. Here are a few highlights from the semester.

- St. Mary's Grade School students raised almost \$14,000 towards their new playground in November during a Walk-a-Thon event. Generous donations were collected by the grade school students from family, friends, and community members. The new playground is scheduled to begin "construction" this summer. The estimated cost of the playground is \$90,000 and so far \$60,092 has been raised for the project.
- The One Acts team had a successful season. The team performed the play "Do Not Go Gentle." One of the highlights was the team taking 1st place in the NVC One Act Competition. The team placed 3rd in a tight district competition.
- The Winter sports season is off and running. The Basketball and Wrestling teams have both seen some success in the early stages of the season and hope to continue that success through the season.
- The wrestling team has three wrestlers this year. In the O'Neill High School meet this past weekend Jared Atkeson placed 1st in the 170 lb weight class, Tate Shoemaker placed 2nd in the 152 lb weight class, and Cole Rosenkrans placed 2nd in the 220 lb weight class.
- We hosted the VFW Veteran's Day program at St. Mary's this year. It is nice to see our students, the public school students, and members of the community come together to recognize the efforts put forth by our Veterans that have served past and present.
- The St. Mary's Facebook page has been very active this year. With the help of Jennie Schneider and Paula Atkeson the content is updated almost daily. There are several things posted such as current events, activity results and scores, featured teachers and students, and just general happenings at St. Mary's.
