From Our Principal

It is tough to believe that we are already celebrating the Christmas season, but here we are! The fall semester of 2016 has gone very quickly. Here are a few highlights from the semester.

- The Senior class of 2017 has recorded the highest ever ACT average score of a graduating class on record. The class of 2017 had a composite average ACT score of 26.1 and an ACT super score average of 26.8. To put this in perspective, the Nebraska state average is around 21.
- 40 iPads have been purchased for student use, as a memorial for '04 SMH graduate, Jesse Peetz. We thank the Peetz family for their generosity in helping us to enhance our technology. The iPads are currently in the teacher's hands as they learn how to integrate them into their classes. When we return from Christmas break the iPads will be placed into a cart that teachers can check out and use in their classrooms.
- The volleyball team made their 5th consecutive state tournament appearance. They lost in the first round of the D-2 State Volleyball Tournament to a tough Wynot team in 5 sets. The football team made it to the 2nd round of D-2 State Football Playoffs. The team had only one loss during regular season and played a tough game against Blue Hill, but unfortunately, did not come out on top. We will be graduating several Seniors that have been great leaders on these teams through their years at St. Mary's that will be missed.
- The Winter sports season is off and running. The Basketball and Wrestling teams have both seen success in the early stages of the season.
- We are in the final stages of preparing for our AdvancED accreditation review to be held in January. Many people have put many hours into this review that is required for Nebraska school accreditation.

Just a Note

A note from John G. (Jerry) Regan, dated 7-7-16. *My mother was Mary N. Donlin Regan. She graduated from St. Mary's Academy in the year of 1916 (100 years ago!) and she was the daughter of Thomas & Kate Casidy Donlin. Her father Thomas Donlin lived in O'Neill for many years. He also owned the Fort Randall Ranch in Mix County, South Dakota. There is a book "Western Democrat" by Arthur F. Mullen, a close friend of the Donlin family, that tells the story of the early pioneers in that part of the country and Donlin family of early days.
